Shoo the Flu is a public health program that provides free in-school flu vaccinations for Oakland-area elementary students and staff.

9,052

total vaccinations given across 95 schools in 2019



100%

of participating schools surveyed agree that Shoo the Flu was a positive experience for their staff, students, and families

21%

was the average participation rate (range: 4%-58%)

42%

of total vaccines administered were to low income and/or uninsured students (52%-60% at OUSD schools!)

19%

of vaccines administered were to school staff/adults

35 schools

increased student participation compared to last year
